Getinge employs 265 people in Monroe County. In 2007, Getinge invested approximately \$6 million to renovate the company's 280,000 square foot shared facility in Henrietta.

PTAC At Work A QUICK CASE STUDY

Monroe County Economic Development and its Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC) program help firms explore and form working relationships.

Rich Bergen was looking for the right match to help his business succeed. Rich needed a reliable source to provide a consistent supply of components to the federal government. Marc lacona was looking to expand his firm, Simcona, into new markets. Rich Bergen and Marc lacona partnered to form AmeriVet Solutions.

AmeriVet Solutions, a service-disabled veteran-owned firm supplies electronics to the federal government. The firm's first contract was awarded by the US Department of the Interior. AmeriVet Solutions will leverage this success in pursuing additional government sales.

Rich stated, "If there are companies that are out there interested in government contracting then PTAC should be the first stop."

The project consisted of reconfiguring the manufacturing floor, building office space, and constructing a new showroom. Getinge received a sales tax exemption on the construction materials and equipment through COMIDA and a capital grant from New York State.

"It was the sales tax incentives from Monroe County and the capital grant from New York State that played a key role in the business case to remain in New York State and make the necessary investment in our Henrietta facility," said John Aymong, President of Getinge Sourcing, LLC.

Paley Studios, LTD has outgrown their existing space in the City of Rochester and will be relocating to a new studio located at 1555 Lyell Avenue.

Monroe County will be providing assistance to Paley Studios, LTD through the GreatRebate/EquiPlus program which provides a sales tax exemption and a rebate on \$245,000 of new equipment purchased to equip the new facility.

Paley Studios, LTD employs 14 in Monroe County and expects to create 2 new full time positions.
